V A A	Learned counsel appearing for the U.P. Pollution			
119	Control Board submits that a joint inspection was conducted on 24 <sup>th</sup> May, 2015 and as per the report the			
W/Z	Unit is found to be compliant with the directions issued by			
	the joint inspection team or the U.P. Pollution Control			
3	Board.  We have perused the report of the joint inspection team. In the joint inspection report the Unit has been			
	called upon to take certain steps including installation of			
	the advance technology for treating the spent wash.  Learned counsel appearing for the industry submits that			
	they have already installed the incinerators and would			
	operate the same regularly without default and delay. He			
	further submits that the industry will comply with the			
	conditions stated in the joint inspection and/or directions			

issued by the Pollution Control Board.

According to the Joint inspection team and the Learned counsel appearing for U.P. Pollution Control Board the industry would be permitted to operate. However with effect from September, 2015 as due to rainy season the composting system cannot work effectively. He further submits that once the incinerator becomes operational need for operating composting system would not arise. The Unit may start its operations within two weeks from today. The joint inspection team will inspect the Unit again and verify whether the incinerator is working effectively and composting system needs to be abandoned.

In the event of abandonment of the composting system because of operationalisation of the incinerator, the Board shall recommend what steps the industry should take to close the composting pits if they are using otherwise.

The joint inspection team shall examine whether discharge from the industry needs to be closed, if so, then the industry shall comply with such direction.

The discharge point in the Ikra Nallah through the township as indicated then shall be closed by the industry forthwith. The township corporation will help the industry to close the said discharge point at the cost of the industry. The industry shall not discharge any effluent into the Ikra Nallah. With the above directions, Original Application No. 327 of 2014 stands disposed of without any order as to costs.
