Let copies thereof be furnished to all the Learned Counsel appearing in the case. They are directed to be taken on record.</p> <p>We would take up the matter in relation to the drains that has been specified in the Joint Inspection Report at the first instance in relation to prevention and control of pollution and consequent rejuvenation of river Ganga. We may notice that all the Respondents without exception and the concerned stakeholders have admitted to the correctness of this Report and do not wish to file any objection in that behalf. Therefore, we will treat this Report not only as a joint Inspection Report but a document admitted by all the Respondents in this case. The Applicant is at liberty to submit his suggestions.</p> <p>We direct all the Respondents particularly, CPCB, UPPCB, UP Jal Nigam, NMCG, UPSIDC and the representative of the State Government not below the rank of a Joint Secretary shall submit to the Tribunal details of all the industrial clusters filed in segment B of phase 1. They shall also submit trade/industrial effluent load in terms of quantity and quality both. They shall also submit the methodology should be adopted for the purposes of treating the trade/industrial effluent whether it is mixed with sewerage or not and what should be the details of the plants to be installed for ensuring that the trade effluent joining the river, partially or otherwise, should not pollute</p>

Let this be done very expeditiously. UPPCB and Uttar Pradesh State Government shall also submit the details of Chromium, Sulphate manufacturing plants at Rania and other places, including their pollution control systems and compliances.
