	Item No. 6 September 28, 2015	<p>Heard. Perused.</p> <p>The issues raised are similar to those raised in O.A No. 138 of 2015. Directions were passed on 1st September, 2015 in O.A. No. 138 of 2015 as follows:</p> <p><i>“They shall also submit before the Tribunal, the complete and comprehensive proposal in regard to collection and disposal of the Municipal Solid Waste in the entire city of Ghaziabad. Further, we direct that the any person, Authority, Officers or official shall not throw, dump and/or burn any Municipal Solid Waste and other wastes anywhere in the District Ghaziabad particularly on the banks of river Hindon and road adjacent thereto.</i></p> <p><i>It will be for the Nagar Nigam and all those Authorities to place appropriate size of dustbins for encouraging the people to dump the wastes only in the dust bins which shall be transported to a duly identified site meant for the purpose of dumping upon segregation. Any person or officer violating this condition shall be liable to pay instantaneously Rs. 20,000/- as Environmental Compensation and we permit all these authorities along with Police Authorities to impose this Environmental Compensation and recover the same. If any person is found committing default in that regards and resists the recovery, liberty is granted to the Authority to file an application before the Tribunal for appropriate orders.”</i></p> <p>We feel that implementation of these orders would go a long way for redressal of grievances made in the</p>

present application. In addition to the issue of MSW, we were confronted with issue of construction of toilets. Reasonably speaking, we carry an impression that for 210 sq.km of area in the city of Ghaziabad there should be at least one toilet per sq.km. We, therefore, expect from the Nagar Nigam to place before us their plan for devising the means to effectively implement the orders passed in the said O.A. as well as to grant relief in the present case.
