	Control Board and Delhi Pollution Control Committee to
N.	examine the ambient air quality in NCR and file a detail
	statement furnishing the data analysis and further
	recommendation by the department. The Central
	Pollution Control Board has filed report on 10 th February,
	2018 which on perusal we found is without proper data.
	Hence we had imposed a cost of Rs. 10 Lakh and listed it
	on 23 rd April, 2018 to consider those aspects.
	Presently, before us the Miscellaneous Application
	No. 415 of 2018 is moved by the applicant seeking action
	against the respondents who are in default for action
	under the provisions of section 26 and 28 of National

Green Tribunal Act, 2010. It needs no mention that the applicant has highlighted inaction on the part of authorities, to present instances of fire at the site in question.

As we have presence of all the respondents represented by their Learned Counsel we had requested East Delhi Municipal Corporation to bring to the notice of the Tribunal steps taken by it in pursuance to the order dated 22nd March, 2018. It is regretfully noted except stating that the tenders have been floated no statement is forthcoming as to the actual effective steps taken to avert instances of fire in terms of our earlier directions. The learned counsel expresses inability for want of instruction from East Delhi Municipal Corporation. As the situation is serious, we expected serious approach by the Corporation which is lacking.

Even the report was called from the NCT Delhi regarding investigation about causes resulting in fire instances has not been filed though it was stated it is due to mischief.

Be that as it as far as National Highways Authority of India is concerned it is stated that they have already filed report and the East Delhi Municipal Corporation has also filed report.

However as we cannot allow such non compliance again by indifferent attitude of the Authorities concerned and avoid perishing of the life of the people, factual information about the steps taken or being taken is essential.

Hence, we direct the Commission, East Delhi
