<b>Item No. 1 to 3 May 30, 2018</b>	Heard the Learned Counsels for the parties. In respect of recommendation no.5, the respondent/State/authority has to once again look into the system by which milk and water offered at Danghati

Temple, is to be taken care and disposed of in a proper manner for which permanent arrangement is to be made. Presently, the system is that the milk/water flowing from the temple is carried by an underground pipe and then left in a drain on the main Parikarma marg towards Village Anyor. There is a need to explore and survey the area where this pipe can be taken further and treatment plant can be installed. The treated water is then to be used for plantation in the nearby area.

As regards the Temple in Jatipura, a similar situation exist as the milk and water offered flows towards the south and it is proposed that treatment plant would be installed at a location where the space between the constructions and Parvath is hardly 10 to 15 feet. Thus it will not be feasible to have the pipeline as well as the treating plant. Therefore, the respondent are directed to further survey for a space for treating plant so that only pipeline is layed in the path between the constructed area and the Giriraj Parvath. The treatment plant should be minimum 50 feet away from the Parvath.

In case of Mansi Ganga, it is said that milk offered to the deity is collected in a pit and from there it is pumped and carried through flexible pipe upto the main road, from where it is transported by tanker. The tankers are un-loaded in an open space.

Keeping in view the location which is more than 10 feet down from the main road and is in a zig-zag manner, the respondents are directed to revisit the place and find out the method by which permanent pipelines can be laid down so as to carry water from the pit. Water should be

	<p><b>Item No. 1 to 3</b></p> <p><b>May 30, 2018</b></p>	<p>then carried to a place and treated separately.</p> <p>A survey needs to be made as to how many sewerage lines are coming from the neighboring houses and joining Mansi Ganga. All such lines need to be completely stopped. Alternative route be looked into.</p> <p>Further, water at Mansi Ganga needs to be cleaned by pumping it out and if required desilting be also done. For this purpose the State/respondent may consult an expert agency. However, a detailed report with regard to the aforesaid aspect relating to Mansi Ganga be filed separately.</p> <p>A thorough survey be made in respect of sewerage line, required in Goverdhan, including Mansi Ganga and Radha Kund areas. A report should be submitted as to how pipeline network is to be laid down, to connect all the household and the manner in which the waste is to be treated. In respect of solid waste, Learned Counsel submits that collection work, as per the rule, have started.</p> <p>However, a thorough survey in respect of collection of solid waste of Goverdhan and Radha Kund needs to be done. The land fill site is already earmarked.
