PESO as well as State of Uttar Pradesh and all concerned States shall take appropriate action in accordance with law i.e. hazardous waste, chemical waste rules and the PESO as it is the competent authority to issue licenses. In our considered view, being licensing authority it is vested with obligations to ensure that the person/industry do not generate or produce absolute alcohol without obtaining the license prior to such production.2. We direct that the five industries in the State of Uttar Pradesh detail of which as follows:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. They shall not manufacture or produce absolute alcohol till further order.b. Notice may also be issued to them, if they so desire, to apply vacation of this order. <p>The learned counsel for Applicants in M.A. No. 84 of 2016 further submits that in view of this order the concerned authorities are not inspecting site resulting in delay in issuance of licenses.</p>

We do not find any reason to modify our order dated 30th August, 2017, Applicants may apply to the authorities to request to conduct the site inspection. We further direct the authorities to examine facts stated in the application which the applicant has urged to justify grant of license to it whether it is factually correct.</p> <p>Report be filed before the Tribunal within two weeks.
