	This application has been filed by the Respondent seeking			
29 th April, 2014	vacation/modification of the order dated 20 th February, 2014 as well as			
	12 th March, 2014 in O.A. No. 136/2013. Copy of this application has			
20	been furnished to the learned counsel for the Applicant as well as to			
	the learned counsel for the State.			
	Learned counsel for the State has also filed the written			
	submissions as directed vide order dated 12 th March, 2014 with regard			
	to the various mines located around the Sariska Tiger Reserve as well			
	as Jamua Ramgarh Sanctuary. A list of 61 mining leases has been			
	furnished which are as per the statement given in the affidavit of the			
	Assistant Conservator of Forests, Tehla, Tiger Project Sariska within			
	one kilometre radius of the Sariska Tiger Reserve and 23 such mines			
	are within buffer area of the Sariska Tiger Reserve.			

Learned counsel for the State submits that the Mining Department of the State is also carrying out its own survey with regard to mining leases given in the critical tiger habitat of Sariska Tiger Reserve as well as in the buffer area of the Sariska Tiger Reserve and falling within one kilometre distance.

Having considered the submission of the learned counsel for the State, we are of the opinion that since prima facie the Forest Department of the State of Rajasthan has already come to a conclusion that the enlisted mining leases given in the Annexure R1-R2 are within the prohibited zones, we direct that the State shall take necessary steps for ensuring that no mining activity is carried out in the aforesaid 61 plus 23 mining leases and the same shall remain discontinued till further orders. In the meanwhile, the State will be at liberty to carry out a survey for which time is sought by the State as the Mining Department of the State wants to verify the facts given by the Forest Department.
