	Date and Remarks	Orders of the Tribunal
	Item No. 2 October 17, 2014	<p>We have heard learned Counsel appearing for the appellant as well as learned Counsel appearing for the DPCC.</p> <p>In the order of this Tribunal dated 26th May, 2014, we have directed the DPCC to expeditiously deal with the applications filed by the individual appellants for consent to operate which are stated to have been pending for a long time. The Tribunal has also stated that while dealing with such applications, the DPCC shall carry on individual inspection of each of the units and examine as to whether the effluents emitting from each of the units contribute to the pollution or not.</p> <p>We have also given liberty to DPCC to take action if the units are found non-compliant with the pollution norms and their ETPs are not found functioning. By a subsequent order dated 10th September, 2014, this Tribunal has also directed DPCC to dispose of all the pending applications and the matters arising out of show cause notice within two weeks. We are now informed by the learned Counsel</p>

appearing for the DPCC that while they have passed individual orders in respect of certain units, they are considering the applications of the other units and orders will be passed expeditiously.

The learned Counsel has also brought to the notice of this Tribunal at least in respect of one unit, namely, M/s. Shiva Industry wherein there has been discrepancy in the signature and also the identity of the proprietor. We make it clear that it is open to the DPCC to pass appropriate orders in such cases where a fraud has been committed in respect of the identity of the proprietor and in respect of the other units. We hope that the DPCC will pass orders on merits after inspection preferably within a period of 10 weeks. On passing of such orders, it will be open to any party who is aggrieved by such orders to approach individually to this tribunal for filing fresh appeal.

With the above direction, the appeal no. 33/2014 stands disposed of. Accordingly, M.A. Nos. 312/2014 and 313/2014 are closed.
