 (iv) Another room may be identified for storage of general solid waste little away from the central bio-medical waste storage room to eliminate any scope of mixing of these wastes (presently separate adjacent rooms being used for storage of general solid waste and the biomedical wastes).

However, it is revealed that the hospital is compliant with the Biomedical Waste Management Rules, 2016 and Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016.

The Learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the Respondent No. 1, Institute of Human Behavior and Allied Sciences, Delhi submits that the institute has taken steps for complying with the recommendations in as much as an order for microwave treatment of the Bio-medical waste as well as chemical liquid waste has been placed and Application for extraction of ground water is pending before the CGWA despite the institute having made due compliance of its requisitions. It is further submitted that the room has been identified for storage of general solid waste seperate from the bio-medical waste storage room and only approval of the competent authority i.e. Director/Chairman of the Institute is awaited.

We direct the institute to communicate to the Central Pollution Control Board all particulars of the microwave waste treatment unit to be installed within a week and seek its advice of the said treatment unit and install and commission the unit within next one month. Central Pollution Control Board is directed to consider the particulars of the microwave based treatment unit to be installed and advice the institute regarding the proposed installation of the said unit. Institute is further directed to take decision in the matter of seeking approval to the room identified for storage of general solid waste within a week and start operating the said separate room as per the recommendations within a fortnight of this order.

The Central Ground Water Authority is directed to consider the Application of the Institute moved for extraction of ground water and dispose of the same within next one month in accordance with law.
