Mr. Tushar Mehta, learned Solicitor General appearing for the appellant/State, on instructions, submits that on principle, the Government is also interested to adopt all restoration measures noticed by the Tribunal in reference to the damage caused to the Chandrapura Lake and the only grievance is that reserve fund of Rs. 500 crores as ordered by the Tribunal in one go may be split into three-four years so that other projects of the State may not be hampered.

Before we proceed, let Learned Solicitor General may take instructions and place on record the scheduled action plan prepared by the State Government in reference to the alleged pollution of Chandrapura Lake and future steps be taken in implementing the order of the Tribunal.
