The present petition has been preferred in public interest by the petitioner to seek the constitution of a committee of eminent jurists, technical experts, management experts who can propose suggestions for taking all measures including any legislative amendments for following up

on the promises made by the Union of India before the 2021 United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) held in Glasgow, UK (COP-26), so that the committee could lay down a road map for achieving the commitments made by the Indian Government before the UNFCCC.

Mr. Sharma – learned Additional Solicitor General, who appears on advance notice, submits that the Union of India is alive to the problems of climate change, and have formed several committees including the Prime Minister’s Council on Climate Change, which are also focusing their attention on meeting the obligations made by the Indian Government at COP-26. Let a status report in this regard be filed within four weeks.
