July 27, 2015	The Application bring before us the water scarcity in	
	the NCT, Delhi, particularly the one arising out of illegal	
	tapping of groundwater. The Learned Counsel appearing	
	for Respondent No. 1 to 5 submit that the committee	

headed by the Deputy Commissioner in terms of the Notification dated 18<sup>th</sup> May, 2010 is in place and efforts are being made to detect illegal tapping of groundwater.

As regards the use of water by the industry particularly the industrial units situate within the DSIIDC industrial estate Narela and Bawana, we have before us the affidavits dated 13th April, 2015 and 22nd April, 2015 of Delhi Jal Board and DSIIDC respectively filed pursuant to the order dated 05th February, 2015. It is revealed that the DSIIDC had deposited an amount of Rs. 9 Crore with Delhi Jal Board which was collected from Bawana and Narela industrial estate for water supply of 45 mld and industries have deposited an amount of Rs. 8.75 Crore to Delhi Jal Board in terms of order dated 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2014. The industries at present are utilizing g<mark>roundwa</mark>ter and are paying monthly charges to DJB as indicated in the affidavit dated 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2015. It is also a fact that the water which is extracted is being used for industrial purpose and later on the effluent is being delivered to CETP for treatment. The affidavit filed on behalf of DSIIDC on the other hand discloses that the CETP treats the effluent generated by the industrial units of Bawana and Narela and later on discharges the treated water in drains. On query made by us with regard to utilization of treated water generated by the CETP, the DSIIDC in its affidavit reveals that for its use for recycling purposes a separate pipeline from CETP to industrial units have to be laid, and dual piping system from CETP to industry involves risk of the water being used by the workers for drinking and other purpose though it is for the industrial purposes. However, this risk will be very well controlled and reutilization of the treated water for the industrial purposes will ease pressure on the underground resources.

We, therefore, direct DSIIDC to place before us the technical and financial feasibility report in respect of the project of recycling the CETP treated water in industrial cluster. DSIIDC may also identify bulk users of the treated water so as to bring ease in laying of the industrial dual piping network.

Delhi Jal Board shall also place before us the amount collected so far from extraction of groundwater for commercial use. Govt. of NCT, Delhi and DJB shall place before us total number of authorized borewells in the entire region.
