whether any industrial waste (Dolo-char) is still found dumped or being dumped over plot Nos. 65, 67 &71 of Kadamdih Residential Area near Chandil Bus stand, Post Office-Chandil, Police Station-Chandil, District Saraikela (Kharsawan) Jharkhand.

For the said inspection, the Department of Forest and Environment, State of Jharkhand, as well as the State Pollution Control Board, Jharkhand shall render all cooperation and assistance to the CPCB team for carrying out the said inspection and make available the required information and data.

A copy of memorandum of Appeal along with the replies and copies of our order shall be communicated to Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) at the cost of the appellant within one week hence. Requisites will be filed for the said purpose.

The report shall be submitted by the CPCB, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the order as well as other documents.
