Report of the Court Commissioner dated 06.04.2016 makes a clear assertion that no illegal mining of the sand was done in the area. It proceeds to state that little distance away from the flood plains of Ganga, sand was found stocked with the trucks and JCB around; and one Mr. Subash Chand and Mr. Mohammad Ali approached him with the license dated 20.08.2007 granted by the D.M. Jyotiba Phule Nagar to stock the sand.</p> <p>Learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the Applicant submits that stocking of the sand has been done contrary to the provisions of Environmental Law.
