work as regard the plantation of the trees meant for handling treated effluent generated by the CETP is not yet complete. Learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the Applicant Respondents submits that a plan for plantation of such trees would be placed before us on the next date of hearing. We also find from the reading of the order dated 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2015 as well as affidavit in support of the Action Taken Report that the facts regarding certain compliances – namely, the District Collector's report regarding the operations of the borewells in critical dark zone area declared by Central Groundwater Authority, fate of the application for consent made for disposal of Hazardous Waste under Hazardous Waste rules by the individual units, work of installation of R.O. in the CETP, are not before us.

We, therefore, have to wait for these facts and responses of the individual non-applicants to come before us before we pass any order. We believe that the funds would be released for installation of R.O. in CETP expeditiously.
